


When Do I Need to Register?

Get Passport Now!

Passport

- Must have valid passport with expiration date more than 6 months after return date
- Cannot be torn or frayed
- Must have at least 2 pages blank for immigration stamps

2018 predicted to be busy passport season – longer waits 6 weeks

Irish Visas NOT required for US citizens

 You need to fly out of the US no later than Thursday, May 31st!!!!




- Program ends July 1st early in the am
- Fares typically rise in spring
 - \$1173 program dates Tulsa-Dublin Student Universe yesterday
 - \$1316 program dates Tulsa-Dublin Kayak yesterday
 - \$1148 program dates Tulsa-Dublin- CheapFare Guru yesterday
 Fares from hub cities less expensive
 - \$871 program dates Dallas-Dublin Cheap Fare Guru
 - \$777 program dates Chicago Dublin TripAdvisor
 - \$638 program dates New York City Dublin Cheap Fare Guru

Early spring- apply for Financial Aid

Financial Aid Available Student Budget - \$8,050

- Good news TU aid in 2018 will be paid in lump sum just before program begins
- TU students must take 6 credit hours <u>in summer</u> for federal financial aid
- TU students in early spring, see Kristi Emerson in Student Financial Services

Option to apply 1/12th of 2018-19 partial tuition scholarship to summer school



How much will it cost?

Dublin 2018

- Tuition \$3,8006 credits
- Housing \$1312.50
 (30 days)

 Total = \$5,112.50

Air Fare \$1,000 -1200

Summer Tuition on TU campus -2018 \$1,000 per credit hour 6 hours = \$6,000


